

To further any charitable purpose for the benefit of disadvantaged people residing permanently in Latin America. In particular, by preserving and protecting health, relieving sickness, relieving poverty and advancing education.

Provide funding for specific health and education projects identified in any country in Latin America.

La Vida is 100% volunteer run. All of the Trustees and Executive Committee work on a voluntary basis and aim to keep expenses to a minimum so the money raised goes directly to the project beneficiaries.

Donations and fundraising have allowed us to improve and directly benefit the lives of around 28,000 people (children and their families) across Latin America.

We continue to fund health and education projects throughout the region. In 2012 we continued to support our existing on-going projects in Bolivia, Colombia, Peru and Guatemala. We approved a new youth education project in Campinas, Brazil, a clean water project at a school in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico and an education project in Ecuador.

We also worked more closely with other foundations forming stronger relations and partnerships and successfully secured additional funding for many of our on-going and new projects.

Policy on grant making:

The Trustees of LA VIDA endeavour to directly grant funding to specific projects that relieve sickness and /or improve education in any Latin American country. Preference will be given to independent projects, but trustees could also look to partner with local organisations that will see through the success and completion of compelling projects in health and education in Latin America.

The project committee meets every 3 months to discuss and approve new project proposals. We assess our projects in depth and have a rigorous selection process. Each grant application has to complete our project proposal form and give proof of identity of their organisation and the people running it, 2 years of bank statements. Every project we support has a partnership agreement signed by La Vida and the organisation receiving the project funding with us which includes all of our reporting requirements. The agreement outlines the timeline of the project with the final goals to be reached, all of our reporting requirements such as photos of the project, receipts for items purchased etc.

The executive committee of 7 people, all of whom are volunteers, continues to help organise the fundraising events, develop the website, publish newsletters and broaden the reach of the charity.

Section D

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

2012 was a record fundraising year as we raised £74,443. Our annual fundraiser which we co-hosted for the first time with the LATA Foundation, Brazilian Carnival Frenzy, took place in October and was our most successful so far, raising over £33,000, thanks to the sponsorships of 3 Brazilian banks in London, ticket sales, a raflle and a silent auction. In July, 11 runners participated in the British London 10k and raised over £5,000.

During 2012, we granted £55,722 to causes across Latin America. We are continuing to support the following projects:

- In Guatemala Breastfeeding support project in the Hospital San Juan de Dios in Guatemala City helping up to 1000 newborn babies and their mothers who lack nutritional education.
- <u>In Peru</u> La Vida has continued to provide scholarships to 46 kids from an under-privileged area in Lima to attend the Villa Maria School. 20 of these students are supported directly by individuals through our 'sponsor a child' programme.
- In Bolivia La Vida continued to support Helping Hands students enabling them to continue their university studies in La Paz.
- In Colombia La Vida continued to support the Poder Joven Foundation, in particular their program Casa Maren, which is located in Medellin. This house assists 75 children between the ages of 3 and 12 that live in precarious conditions. Poder Joven provide a preventative program that helps at risk children find a better alternative to the streets through our funding.

New disbursements in 2012

- <u>In Ecuador</u> Funding to the Bua- Yanapuma Foundation to support computer training for community groups in Bua.
- In Mexico Funds were sent to Clínica de Beneficencia 'Amistad Británico-Mexicana,' a charity hospital built by our partner in Mexico City, Amistad-Británico. Treating 8,000+ patients a year, the hospital provides treatment for those who have no access to medical services through public or private insurance. Built for victims of the 1985 earthquake, this hospital is currently undergoing an essential first modernization. We funded vital diagnostic and surgical equipment for treatment and some refurbishment of rooms and common areas for a clean, safe and hygienic environment.

New Projects for 2013

 In Brazil, we approved a youth education project called Acao Forte in the city of Campinas. Funds were raised in 2012 and will be sent in 2013.

- In addition we will fund a NLM Health and Hygiene at the same school in Puerto Vallarta teaching children the importance of washing their hands properly and how to clean their teeth.
